# **Martien's Musings**

I read an interesting piece of research this week from the Barna group in the USA. The research set out to explore the connections between faith and technology in the age group they call the Millennials, from age 18 -29 years of age. This group is very technology friendly. The first and last things they do each night is check their phones, they google for answers to questions and they have more electronic "friends" than they can actually name. For Christian Millennials;

- 70% do their bible reading from a screen, using phones, ipads, or computers
- 54% access either preaching or worship music online
- 56% use online search to determine which church to attend
- 59% search for the answers to spiritual questions online
- 38% use online services, often within the church service, to verify what is being said by Christian leaders
- 40% participate in on line conversations about faith
- 39% do their giving online (this figure does not include automatic payments)
- 20% text to donate

The world is changing, but then it always has.

The data does raise interesting questions about church gatherings. If you can get excellent teaching and worship off the internet what is the point of a church service? The answer must lie in the area of relationship i.e. loving one another. Sure we can hold electronic conversations; twitter, skype and chat rooms make that easy. Is there anything missing? Is there anything that a digital world does not offer that we need for developing an authentic faith? Try these for starters

- 1. The opportunity to welcome a stranger.
- The opportunity to give someone a hug and tell them you are there with them.
- 3. The need and opportunity to work through your differences rather than just 'unfriend' them.
- Teachers and prophets who speak into your need because they know you rather than those messages you select because they suit you.
- Certainty that the person you talk with looks like and is like their electronic profile.
- 6. Body language to authenticate words.
- 7. When God pours out revival power on a Christian community do we really believe that will come through a modem.

Some of you reading this will 'tut' 'tut' over what the world is coming to. Some personal reflection about why you and I come to church may make us a little more humble because we do not always achieve points 1-7 above even when we turn up regularly. We have not always given enough attention to the relational inheritance God has given us in the saints (Eph 1:18)
