Pastor's Musings

At the beginning of His ministry Jesus went out into the wilderness and was tested by the devil. As we all know He passed the test and did not give into the devil's invitations, hints or suggestions. I wonder what we imagine the devil did then. Did he slink away beaten and never reappear to challenge Jesus again? Or did he set about the task of destroying and undermining the ministry of Jesus. We see the devil entering Judas Iscariot to betray Jesus (John 13:27). Jesus declares that the Pharisees "belong to their father the devil" (John 8:44). In Matthew 16 Jesus identifies Peter's desire to prevent Him from going to Jerusalem as the actions of the devil.

Revelation 12 describes the devil (the dragon), defeated on the cross, as filled with fury and going after all those who keep God's commands and hold fast to their testimony. What does that mean for us? As we seek to know and live faithfully to God's purposes, both personally and as a congregation, we should be expecting the devil to retaliate. He does this through demonic spirits because the devil himself is not everywhere at the same time. He is not omnipresent, only God is. However he does represent himself across the world through demonic (evil) spirits who in turn will work through anyone that gives them a foothold. Ephesians 6 invites us to put on the whole armour of God, faith, righteousness, salvation, truth, the gospel of peace, the sword of the spirit the word of God. All of these are important so that we might take our stand against the devils schemes. Paul points out that we do have a struggle against spiritual authorities, powers and rulers. Please note that he writes that we do have this struggle, not that we may have this struggle.

The word in Ephesians 6 comes as a conclusion to Paul's discussion from Chapters 4, 5 and the first part of Ch 6. All of this material is about living well with each other. The priorities of unity and love for one another are high. Paul is extensive in his warnings against bitterness, complaining and anger amongst us. It is because our relational base is high that we are able to stand. Faith, righteousness, salvation, truth, the gospel of peace and the sword of the spirit all find their place in our lives when we honour each other and avoid all division. Anything less Paul writes is a foothold for the devil.

A week ago a church leader, from another Baptist church outside Taranaki, visiting Central warned us that prophetically they saw the devil as like an Octopus with its tentacles reaching out even now over the church as if

looking for a hole in a wall. Based on Ephesians this would be searching out for a hole in the wall of our love and unity. Why would we be surprised? But let us not be complacent in our love and respect for one another. The Apostle Peter presents the same message in his first letter encouraging us to "Be alert and of sober mind. Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour. Resist him, standing firm in the faith ..."
