## **Martien's Musings**

I want to express a great big thank you to everyone who contributed to making the jubilee last week a success. A lot of hard work goes into an event like that. It all went smoothly, I received great feedback from many of our guests and our invited speakers were very enthusiastic about the life they found here amongst us. It was a big team that made it happen and I cannot list all the names. I will mention and acknowledge a superb effort by Cherry who took on the co-ordination of the weekend. Well done and thank you Cherry.

I am reflecting on the message of the weekend. We asked our two guest speakers plus myself to tell us here at Central, in 7.5 minutes each, what God is saying to the church. –They did not consult with each other in coming to their message. Here is the briefest of summaries

John Douglas – President of the Baptist Union quoted "The testimony of Jesus is the Spirit of Prophecy" from Revelation 19:10 - We here at Central are called to be a prophetic organisation, a prophetic people, a prophetic community. We are called to refresh and grow this purpose. He offered three prompting words

<u>Message</u>: The prophetic message, whether spoken, or lived, or acted always follows hearing God first. The prophetic message is the general and essential element of the people of God.

<u>Motivation</u>: The love of Christ constrains us, His love is the motivator, we are prophetic because we have experienced His love and allowed His love to touch our hearts and will allow His love to be seen and experienced in our city.

<u>Mood:</u> How we say things and how we live is important. It should be bathed in love, gentleness and grace

Len Buttner of Eagle Ascend Ministries and a pastor/ prophet in the Elim Churches brought us these words (summarised)

'This church carries a prophetic DNA and we are encouraged to rise up into it. This DNA calls for us to be led by the Spirit both as individuals and corporately. What makes us prophetic is our ability to hear.' He offered three words to reinforce this understanding:

<u>Presence:</u> We are encouraged to enter even more into prayer which brings breakthrough and praise and worship ,which can bring us into intimacy with God.

## Martien's Musings cont...

<u>Passion</u>; Intimacy of relationship with God will grow in us a passion for the things of God. Knowing His heart will motivate and move us to be a prophetic people, to hear him and speak and act for Him. God is stirring up the comfortable in Central Baptist to restore and build our passion.

<u>Purity</u>: There is a call to remain pure in our devotion and commitment to God and out of that will come and grow purity of thought, action and motivation.

Neither of these two men were asked to speak on the prophetic. However they have the same Lord so why would we be surprised that when they each ask the Lord what He is saying to Central Baptist that He gives them essentially the same message. More is the point, are we willing to hear God's words through these speakers. My own hearing from God is available in printed form.
